In Year 1... Year 1 have had a fantastic final week of the half-term. From considering how to care for the world in RE, to completing a materials quiz in Science, we simply haven't stopped! In English, we have completed our final piece of writing linked to our story, 'Do Not Enter Zoo'. In Maths, we have been placing numbers on marked and unmarked number lines. Well done Year 1!

We have had a visit from Open the Book to talk about the bible, we have visited Penketh Methodist Church to learn about Lent and we have completed an electricity workshop! What a busy half term!!
