OUR LEARNING

In Reception...Reception have been searching for Naughty Bus this week! We have written missing posters and stuck them up around school to let everyone know he has gone. We have also been painting pictures of the bus and singing our Naughty Bus song! We hope he returns safely to us next week...

In Year 1... This week, we have been practising how to count in 10s,! We have counted forwards and backwards to 100 with great confidence. We also loved our trip to The Bridgewater Hall in Manchester, to watch a concert all about dinosaurs with the Halle Orchestra.

The children were exceptionally well behaved and we couldn't have been prouder!



In Year 2...We loved our trip with Year 1 to The Bridgewater Hall. It was amazing to see all of the different musical instruments and the dinosaurs. In English, we have started our new story, 'The Last Wolf' and have made predictions of what the story is about after looking at the front cover. In Maths, we have sequenced the events of our school day and put them into chronological order.

In Year 3... This week Year 3 have begun work on a new text, 'Rhythm in the Rain'. They have explored the text, looked at new vocabulary and used conjunctions to help them describe the different settings within the book. In Science, they are continuing their work on light, investigating what reflection is and how some materials are more reflective than others.

In Year 4... The children have started to learn about textile designers, from the Victorian designer William Morris to Cath Kidston, who has shops world wide and designer Mary White from the sixties. We are creating a design for a tote bag and making a bookmark and would love a little extra help sewing our designs that will be inspired from these famous artists. Watch out for a letter from Mrs Kayll. Please help us bring our designs to life!!

In Year 5... This week Y5 have produced stunning recounts in the form of a diary entry. They have retold the day that Phillipe Petit tightrope walked across the Twin Towers in New York City. In Maths we have looked at fraction to decimal equivalents. We have also experimented with air resistance in Science by creating parachutes.

In Year 6...We have enjoyed Forest School this week. Firstly, we created Forest School names for ourselves and then, after we had built dens we challenged each other to 'sword' fights with twigs! In Maths, we estimated how long it would take to count to one million using the book 'How Big is One Million' as inspiration.
