OUR LEARNING

In Reception...In Maths this week,

Reception have been exploring how to represent the 'Number Four Numberblock' in lots of different ways by using a lego piece to print on to paper. We had lots of fun representing four in different shapes! We have also loved our P.E

lesson this week with Mr K, searching for hidden treasure whilst practising our throwing and catching skills!



In Year 1...In Year 1 this week, the children have been enjoying writing descriptions of different characters from our current text 'The Lion Inside'. We have been working very hard to remember important things like capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. In Geography, the children have been labelling a map of Penketh, we enjoyed using Google Earth to find the different places first. In Maths, we have been using counters to help us to solve different subtraction problems!

In Year 2...Year 2 have enjoyed writing a diary entry in English. In Maths, we have recapped our number bonds to and within 10. In Science, we looked at different things that are living, non living and have never been alive. In DT, we have designed our own moving vehicle and have learnt about the purpose of a wheel and axel and are beginning to understand how we will make our own. We are looking forward to starting the making process next week.

In Year 3... This week in Year 3 we have enjoyed learning about addition using place value and partitioning and we have worked hard on our times tables. In English, we have been using the past tense to start retelling our class text 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig'. In RE, we have been discussing the attributes of a good leader and we have ranked them based on our own thoughts. We have especially enjoyed this weeks PE lessons, where we were playing lots of fun games with each other including 'Bench Dodgeball'.

In Year 4...This week year 4 have been continuing their work learning how sound works. They made tin telephones and discovered that when the string between the tins was tight they could hear a sound from one tin to another! Mrs Clarke has been blown away by the amount of hard work we have been doing to learn our times tables. Some people have already completed our times table challenge and are moving onto a new challenge. In writing we have completed our descriptive work about the circus tent in 'Leon and the Place Between'. We described what we would see, hear, smell and taste using expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, fronted adverbials and the rule of 3. We are very proud of our written pieces.

In Year 5... This week, Year 5 have written diary entries in the first person and a letter to a newspaper editor, putting a news story into question. In maths, we have learnt how simple equations relate to ones using larger numbers. In DT, we have used the technique 'triangulation' to experiment how to make strong frame structures. We will go on to design and create our own structures next week. The best news... we won our last star for our class treat! Well done, Year 5!

In Year 6... This week, Year 6 have enjoyed drawing simple circuit diagrams in Science, to prepare for building our own electrical circuits next week! In English, we have been using modal verbs and adverbs within our writing to indicate degrees of probability. We've been very busy in our Maths lessons, exploring fractions and tackling some tricky multiplication and division questions. Despite being very busy, we were able to enjoy our class reward time and loved our hot chocolate and snacks! Well done Year 6, keep it up!
