OUR LEARNING

In Reception...Reception have had another busy week! We have been reading our new book, 'The Friendship Bench!' and talking about the new friendships that we have made at school. We are also enjoying our Phonics lessons; this week we have learnt four new phonemes! We are starting to use these new phonemes to create different words!

In Year 1... This week, Year 1 received a mysterious letter and a new book to read - 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. The children have been very excited to read the story and have made some fantastic predictions about what they think might happen! In Computing, we have been considering what information is private and shouldn't be shared online. In Maths, we have been comparing numbers using the language of 'more' and 'fewer'. Another fun-filled week!

In Year 2... This week in English, we wrote some amazing letters from the wolf to apologise to the Three Little Pigs. In Maths, we have worked incredibly hard, using 'Part Whole Models' to create addition and subtraction sentences. In PSHE, we discussed who we can go to for help if we are feeling lonely and in Science, we learnt about the life cycle of a frog! It's been a very busy week!

In Year 3... This week, we have worked hard in our Maths lessons learning about adding 10 and 100, number lines and times tables. We have read further into our class text 'Seal Surfer' and learnt about how a seal's life changes throughout the seasons. We have learnt and wrote our own riddles and we have also enjoyed rehearsing lots of songs! We wrote some very impressive book reviews and had some meaningful conversations about how our mind works and the ways we can help our brain to do the best it can.

In Year 4...In Year 4 this week we have been writing speech sandwiches between Gorilla and Hannah, finding out why Hindus celebrate Diwali and learning the names of our different types of teeth and their functions. I am very proud to say that once again, Year 4 are top of the leader board on TT Rockstars! Great work!!

In Year 5...Year 5 have had another busy week and continued to flourish! In English, we've written diary entries describing the feelings of our 'Lost Things' which are full of interesting and emotive language, thanks to the use of our thesauruses!
